As we usher in the winter months, we'd like to shine a light on our brilliant Youth Work project. We're excited to welcome Ashley Brown to the Barnabas Youth Work team. Ashley will be our Youth Development and Training Lead.

On his appointment, Ashley said "I am delighted to have been given the opportunity to work for Barnabas Safe and Sound as Youth Development and Training Lead. I have over 25 years' experience working with young people. This has seen me work in a variety of places and settings, including Manchester, Jersey and Normandy, France. For the past twenty years I have worked for the Northumberland County Council's Youth Service. During that time I have been able to witness first hand the fantastic potential of young people across this beautiful county. That is not to say that young people do not continue to face considerable challenges today, as they move from adolescence to adulthood. These include the use of social media, the perception of them by others and the continuing effects of coming out of lockdown. This has, in many cases impacted communication skills, anxiety levels and resilience. During my time in this role, I will continue to champion young people and hope to give them many opportunities to develop skills, find positive role models and most importantly have fun during their time with Barnabas Safe and Sound.



Having Ashley on board is perfect timing, as this week (4th-10th November) is Youth Work Week. Perhaps you have seen some of our posts on social media? This year, the theme is "A right to Youth Work for all" - focusing on the importance of youth work spaces, the amazing youth work professionals, and the benefits to mental and physical health through recent surveys.
